L7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
L8	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 4 O.S. 2011, Section 501, is

20	Section 501. A. Any dog, cat or any other animal which is kept
21	for pleasure rather than utility in or about a household, held by or
22	in the custody of a private or public animal shelter or agency and
23	not reclaimed by the owner, may be disposed of only by:

2. Delivery to a licensed educational or research institution in accordance with the provisions of Sections 391 through 402 of this title; or

3. Euthanasia by only one of the following methods:

- a. administration of denatured sodium pentobarbital, or
- b. the use of a carbon monoxide chamber, using

  commercially compressed cylinder gas; provided that

  kittens and puppies under sixteen (16) weeks of age

  shall not be euthanized with carbon monoxide but with

  injections of denatured sodium pentobarbital, or
- e. any other method approved by the Animal Industries

  Services Division of the State Department of

  Agriculture which shall include current acceptable

  euthanasia recommendations from the American

  Veterinary Medical Association, with the exception of

  curariform derivative drugs. The following

  requirements must be met to ensure the euthanasia

  agent is humane:
  - (1) the method should be as painless as possible to the animal as determined by the best available medical and scientific knowledge and technology,
  - (2) the animal should be kept as free from anxiety and fear as possible,
  - (3) the technique should be:

1	(a) simple enough to be used by relatively
2	unskilled personnel,
3	(b) legally available to all animal shelters and
4	humane societies,
5	(c) as mechanically simple and maintenance free
6	as possible within reasonable cost, and
7	(d) physically safe for personnel using it.
8	B. Death should be confirmed by cessation of vital signs.
9	Professional judgment should be used in consideration of the animal
10	species and method of euthanasia to determine the means of
11	confirming death.
12	SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 4 O.S. 2011, Section 508, is
13	amended to read as follows:
14	Section 508. The provisions of Sections $\frac{1}{502}$ through $\frac{7}{507}$ of
15	this act title shall not apply to any municipality with a population
16	of ten thousand (10,000) or less persons according to the latest
17	Federal Decennial Census. However, unclaimed animals must be
18	destroyed by an acceptable, humane method.
19	SECTION 3. REPEALER 4 O.S. 2011, Sections 503 and 504,
20	are hereby repealed.
21	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2014.
