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17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

18 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 241.4 of Title 56, unless there
20 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

21 A. No debit or electronic benefit transfer cards that contain
22 state or federal funds from programs including, but not limited to,
23 Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) may be used in any
24 transaction in:

1 1. Any liquor store;

2 2. Any casino, gambling casino or gaming establishment;

3 3. Any retail establishment which provides adult-oriented
4 entertainment in which performers disrobe or perform in an unclothed
5 state for entertainment; or

6 4. Any retail establishment whose principal business is that of
7 selling cigarettes, cigar or tobacco products.

8 B. For the purposes of this act:

9 1. "Liquor store" means any retail establishment that sells
10 exclusively or primarily intoxicating liquor but does not include a
11 grocery store that sells both intoxicating liquor and groceries;

12 2. "Casino", "gambling casino" and "gaming establishment" do
13 not include:

14 a. a grocery store that sells groceries and that also
15 offers, or is located within the same building or
16 complex as an establishment that offers casino,
17 gambling or gaming activities, or

18 b. any other establishment that offers casino, gambling
19 or gaming activities incidental to the principal
20 purpose of the business; and

21 3. "Electronic benefit transfer transaction" means the use of a
22 credit or debit card service, automated teller machine, point-of-
23 sale terminal or access to an online system for the withdrawal of
24 funds or the processing of a payment for merchandise or service.

1 C. If the school age dependent of any individual who receives
2 any benefit listed in subsection A of this section is declared
3 truant by a court of competent jurisdiction, all benefits described
4 in subsection A will terminate until further court order, and the
5 Oklahoma Department of Human Services will be immediately notified
6 of the termination.

7 D. By August 1, 2013, the Oklahoma Department of Human Services
8 shall report on the status of an implementation plan pursuant to the
9 provisions of this section. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate
10 and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall be provided
11 with updates on the status of implementation on a quarterly basis
12 until provisions of this section are fully implemented by the
13 Department.

14 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2013.

15 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
16 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
17 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
18 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
