10	An Act relating to nonresident pharmacies; requiring
11	nonresident pharmacies to submit certain information in applications for license issuance or renewal;
12	providing for certain fees; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 355.3 of Title 59, unless there
18	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	As used in this act:
20	1. "Nonresident pharmacy" means any pharmacy located outside of
21	this state which delivers, dispenses, or distributes by any method
22	prescription drugs or devices to a user physically located in this
23	state; and
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2. "Pharmacist-in-charge" means a professionally competent, legally qualified pharmacist responsible for compliance with all laws and regulations governing the operation of the respective pharmacy.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 355.4 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A nonresident pharmacy, in addition to the initial application or renewal form and other documents required for a pharmacy located in Oklahoma, shall:

- 1. Submit an affidavit signed by the pharmacist-in-charge that the pharmacy shall comply with non-sterile and sterile compounding standards of the newest edition of the United States Pharmacopeial and United States Food and Drug Administration Good Manufacturing Practices; and
- 2. Pay an additional fee of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) over and above the licensing and inspection fees charged to in-state pharmacies to cover the additional costs associated with administrative review and consideration of documents listed in subparagraphs a and b of paragraph 3 of this section; and
- 3. Submit a pharmacy site inspection form completed and signed within the previous eighteen (18) months by a person authorized by the pharmacy's resident state agency or board which is responsible for issuing pharmacy licenses, or:

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1	a. Submit a pharmacy site inspection form completed and
2	signed within the previous eighteen (18) months by a
3	staff person employed by the Oklahoma State Board of
4	Pharmacy and pay all costs incurred by the Board for
5	completion of the inspection, or
6	b. Submit an inspection report or certificate of
7	approval, from an organization approved by the
8	Oklahoma State Board of Pharmacy, which shall include
9	the standards and procedures to which the pharmacy
10	demonstrated compliance.
11	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2013.
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
