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6	An Act relating to student testing; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1210.508, as last amended by Section 1,
7	Chapter 403, O.S.L. 2013 (70 O.S. Supp. 2013, Section 1, 1210.508), which relates to criterion-referenced
8	tests; prohibiting the State Board of Education from developing and administering tests for grades three
9	through eight not required by federal law; removing requirement for testing in certain subjects and
10	certain grades; removing a requirement for a fine arts assessment and report; providing an effective
11	date; and declaring an emergency.
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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1210.508, as
16	last amended by Section 1, Chapter 403, O.S.L. 2013 (70 O.S. Supp.
17	2013, Section 1210.508), is amended to read as follows:
18	Section 1210.508. A. 1. The State Board of Education shall
19	develop and administer a series of criterion-referenced tests
20	designed to indicate whether the state academic content standards,
21	as defined by the State Board of Education in the Priority Academic
22	Student Skills Curriculum, which Oklahoma public school students are
23	expected to have attained have been achieved. The Beginning with
24	the 2014-2015 school year, the Board may shall not develop and or

administer any criterion-referenced test <u>for grades three through</u>
<u>eight</u> in any subject not required by federal law, <u>contingent upon</u>
the availability of funding. Students who do not perform at least
at the proficient level on tests shall be remediated, subject to the
availability of funding.

2. Contingent upon the availability of state and federal funds,
the Board, in accordance with federal law, shall administer
criterion-referenced tests for grades three and four in:

a. reading, and

b. mathematics.

Contingent upon the availability of funds, the Board shall
 administer criterion-referenced tests for grade five in:

- 13 a. reading,
- 14 b. mathematics, and

15 c. science,

16d. social studies, which shall consist of the history,17Constitution and government of the United States, and

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geography, and

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e. writing of English.

Contingent upon the availability of state and federal funds,
 the Board, in accordance with federal law, shall administer
 criterion-referenced tests for grades six and seven in:

a. reading, and

- 1 In addition, the Board shall administer a criterion-referenced
 2 test in geography in grade seven.
- 3 5. Contingent upon the availability of funds, the Board shall 4 administer criterion-referenced tests for grade eight in:
- 5 a. reading,
 - b. mathematics, and
 - c. science_r
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- d. social studies, which shall consist of the history, Constitution, and government of the United States, and
- 10

e. writing of English.

The Board shall administer the tests for grade eight in reading and mathematics online with raw score test results reported immediately and complete results reported in less than two (2) weeks beginning in the 2007-08 school year.

6. Except as otherwise provided for in Section 1210.523 of this 15 title, each student who completes the instruction for English II, 16 English III, United States History, Biology I, Algebra I, Geometry, 17 and Algebra II at the secondary level shall complete an end-of-18 instruction test, when implemented, to measure for attainment in the 19 appropriate state academic content standards in order to graduate 20 from a public high school with a standard diploma. All students 21 shall take the tests prior to graduation, unless otherwise exempt by 22 law. The State Board of Education shall administer the criterion-23 referenced tests. The Board shall develop and field test the end-24

of-instruction tests in English III, Geometry, and Algebra II during the 2006-07 school year, implement the tests during the 2007-08 school year, and administer them each year thereafter. The Board shall administer the multiple choice portion of the end-ofinstruction tests online with raw score test results reported immediately and complete results reported in less than two (2) weeks beginning in the 2008-09 school year.

The end-of-instruction tests shall serve the purpose of the 8 9 criterion-referenced tests as provided in paragraph 1 of this 10 subsection. The English II and English III end-of-instruction tests 11 shall include a writing component. Students who do not score at 12 least at the proficient level shall be afforded the opportunity to retake each test up to three (3) times each calendar year until at 13 least achieving at the proficient level. In order to provide an 14 15 indication of the levels of competency attained by the student in a permanent record for potential future employers and institutions of 16 higher education, for students who enter the ninth grade in or prior 17 to the 2007-08 school year, school districts shall report the 18 highest-achieved state test performance level on the end-of-19 instruction tests on the student's high school transcript. 20 Beginning with students who enter the ninth grade in the 2008-09 21 school year, school districts shall report the highest-achieved 22 state test performance level on the end-of-instruction tests and any 23 business and industry-recognized endorsements attained on the 24

1 student's high school transcript. Any student at the middle school 2 level who completes the instruction in a secondary course specified 3 in this paragraph shall be administered the appropriate end-of-4 instruction test.

5	7. a.	Each school district shall administer to each student
6		in the school district in grades three through eight
7		an assessment designed to assess the student in the
8		fine arts area in which the student has received
9		instruction.
10	b.	Each school district shall prepare an annual report

11 for approval by the State Board of Education outlining 12 the fine arts assessment strategies used by the 13 district, when the assessments were administered, how 14 many students were assessed during the previous year, 15 and the results of the assessments.

1. All criterion-referenced tests required by this section 16 в. shall measure academic competencies in correlation with the state 17 academic content standards adopted by the Board pursuant to Section 18 11-103.6 of this title and known as the Priority Academic Student 19 Skills Curriculum. The State Board of Education shall evaluate the 20 academic content standards to ensure the competencies reflect high 21 standards, are specific, well-defined, measurable, challenging, and 22 will prepare elementary students for next-grade-level course work 23 and secondary students for postsecondary studies at institutions of 24

higher education or technology center schools without the need for
 remediation in core curriculum areas. All state academic content
 standards shall reflect the benchmarks of the American Diploma
 Project and the goal of improving the state average ACT score.

5 2. The State Department of Education shall annually evaluate the results of the criterion-referenced tests. The State Board of 6 Education shall ensure that test results are reported to districts 7 in a manner that yields detailed, diagnostic information for the 8 9 purpose of guiding instruction and student remediation. As 10 improvements are made to the criterion-referenced tests required by 11 this section, the Board shall seek to increase the depth of 12 knowledge assessed for each subject. The State Board of Education shall seek to ensure that data yielded from the tests required in 13 this section are utilized at the school district level to prescribe 14 reinforcement and/or remediation by requiring school districts to 15 develop and implement a specific program of improvement based on the 16 17 test results.

The State Board of Education in coordination with the Office 18 3. of Educational Quality and Accountability shall review, realign, and 19 recalibrate, as necessary, the tests in reading and mathematics in 20 third through eighth grade and the end-of-instruction tests. 21 The Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability shall 22 determine the cut scores for the performance levels on the end-of-23 instruction tests developed pursuant to paragraph 6 of subsection A 24

of this section. The Commission shall conduct an ongoing review to
 compare the end-of-instruction test content and performance
 descriptors with those of other states. Upon receipt of the review,
 the Commission may adjust the cut scores as necessary.

5 4. The State Board of Education, for the purposes of conducting reliability and validity studies, monitoring contractor adherence to 6 professionally accepted testing standards, and providing 7 recommendations for testing program improvement, shall retain the 8 9 services of an established, independent agency or organization that 10 is nationally recognized for its technical expertise in educational 11 testing but is not engaged in the development of aptitude or 12 achievement tests for elementary or secondary level grades. These national assessment experts shall annually conduct studies of the 13 reliability and validity of the end-of-instruction tests 14 administered pursuant to this section. Validity studies shall 15 include studies of decision validity and concurrent validity. 16

С. 1. The State Board of Education shall set the testing 17 window dates for each criterion-referenced test required in 18 paragraphs 1 through 5 of subsection A of this section for grades 19 three through eight so that, with the exception of the writing 20 $assessments_{r}$ the tests are administered to students no earlier than 21 April 10 each year and so that the test results are reported back to 22 school districts in a timely manner. Each criterion-referenced test 23 required in paragraph 6 of subsection A of this section may be 24

1 administered to students at a time set by the State Board of 2 Education as near as possible to the end of the course; provided, if a school district is unable to administer the tests online to all 3 students taking the test for the first time and all students 4 5 retaking the test during the testing window time set by the Board, the school district may elect to administer any of the tests to 6 students retaking the test at any time not more than two (2) weeks 7 prior to the start of the testing window time set by the Board. All 8 9 results and reports of the criterion-referenced test series required 10 in paragraphs 1 through 5 of subsection A of this section for grades 11 three through eight shall be returned to each school district prior 12 to the beginning of the next school year. The vendor shall provide a final electronic data file of all school site, school district, 13 and state results to the State Department of Education and the 14 Office of Educational Quality and Accountability prior to September 15 1 of each year. The Department shall forward the final data files 16 17 for each school district and each school site in that district to the school district. The Board shall ensure the contract with the 18 testing vendor includes a provision that the vendor report test 19 results directly to the Office of Educational Quality and 20 Accountability at the same time it is reported to the Board. 21

State, district, and site level results of all tests
 required in this section shall be disaggregated by gender, race,
 ethnicity, disability status, migrant status, English proficiency,

1 and status as economically disadvantaged, except that such 2 disaggregation shall not be required in a case in which the number 3 of students in a category is insufficient to yield statistically reliable information or the results would reveal personally 4 5 identifiable information about an individual student. Each school site shall notify the student's parents of the school's performance 6 levels in the Oklahoma School Testing Program as reported in the 7 Oklahoma Educational Indicators Program at the end of each school 8 9 year.

10 D. The State Board of Education shall be responsible for the 11 development, field-testing, and validation of the criterion-12 referenced test series required in subsection A of this section. In the interest of economy the Board shall adapt criterion-referenced 13 tests that have been developed by or in collaboration with other 14 15 states or are otherwise commercially available, or portions of such tests, to the extent that such tests are appropriate for use in the 16 testing program to be administered to Oklahoma students. 17

E. The State Board of Education shall develop, administer, and incorporate as a part of the Oklahoma School Testing Program, other testing programs or procedures, including appropriate accommodations for the testing of students with disabilities as required by the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), 20 USC, Section 1400 et seq.

24 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2014.
