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7 [nonresident pharmacies - requiring nonresident
8 pharmacies to submit information in applications -

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11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

12 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 355.4 of Title 59, unless there
14 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

15 As used in this act:

16 1. "Nonresident pharmacy" means any pharmacy located outside of
17 this state which delivers, dispenses, or distributes by any method
18 prescription drugs or devices to a user physically located in this
19 state; and

20 2. "Pharmacist-in-charge" means a professionally competent,
21 legally qualified pharmacist responsible for compliance with all
22 laws and regulations governing the operation of the respective
23 pharmacy.
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1 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified

2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 355.5 of Title 59, unless there
3 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 A nonresident pharmacy, in addition to the initial application
5 or renewal form and other documents required for a pharmacy located
6 in Oklahoma, shall:

7 1. Submit an affidavit signed by the pharmacist-in-charge that
8 the pharmacy shall comply with non-sterile and sterile compounding
9 standards of the newest edition of the United States Pharmacopeial
10 and United States Food and Drug Administration Good Manufacturing
11 Practices; and

12 2. Pay an additional fee of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) over
13 and above the licensing and inspection fees charged to in-state
14 pharmacies to cover the additional costs associated with
15 administrative review and consideration of documents listed in
16 subparagraphs a and b of paragraph 3 of this section; and

17 3. Submit a pharmacy site inspection form completed and signed
18 within the previous eighteen (18) months by a person authorized by
19 the pharmacy's resident state agency or board which is responsible
20 for issuing pharmacy licenses, or:

21 a. submit a pharmacy site inspection form completed and
22 signed within the previous eighteen (18) months by a
23 staff person employed by the Oklahoma State Board of

1 Pharmacy and pay all costs incurred by the Board for
2 completion of the inspection, or

- 3 b. submit an inspection report or certificate of
4 approval, from an organization approved by the
5 Oklahoma State Board of Pharmacy, which shall include
6 the standards and procedures to which the pharmacy
7 demonstrated compliance.

8 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2013.
