A new section of law to be codified 16 NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1953.1 of Title 63, unless 17 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 18 As used in this act: 19 20 "Authorized electronic monitoring" means the placement of electronic monitoring devices in the common areas or rooms of 21 residents of a nursing facility and recordings with the devices 22 pursuant to the provisions of this act; and 23

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- 2. "Electronic monitoring device" means video surveillance cameras installed in the common areas or residents' rooms.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1953.2 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. A nursing facility shall provide notice to current and prospective residents, or legal representatives thereof, that authorized electronic monitoring of a resident's room conducted under this act is not compulsory and shall only be conducted with the consent of the resident, residents, or legal representatives thereof.
- B. A nursing facility shall not refuse to admit an individual to residency in the facility and shall not remove a resident from a facility because of authorized electronic monitoring of a resident's room.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1953.3 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. No person or entity shall intentionally hamper, obstruct, tamper with, or destroy an electronic monitoring device installed in a nursing facility.
- B. Any person or entity that intentionally hampers, obstructs, tampers with, or destroys a recording or an electronic monitoring device installed in a nursing facility shall be subject to the

- 1 penalties prescribed in Section 1993 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma 2 Statutes.
  - C. No person or entity shall intercept a communication or disclose or use an intercepted communication of an electronic monitoring device placed or installed in a common area of a nursing facility without the express consent of the facility, or, for an electronic monitoring device installed in a resident's room, the express consent of the resident or legal representatives thereof.
  - SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1953.4 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
  - Subject to the provisions of law, a tape or recording created through the use of authorized electronic monitoring pursuant to this act may be admitted into evidence in a civil or criminal court action or administrative proceeding.
  - SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1953.5 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
  - Nothing in this act shall be construed to prevent a resident or resident's legal representative from placing an electronic monitoring device in the resident's room at the expense of such person and with the consent of all other residents, or legal representatives thereof, living in the room.
    - SECTION 6. This act shall become effective November 1, 2013.
