8 An Act relating to human trafficking; providing for  
9 the expungement of records under certain  
10 circumstances; sealing records, with exception;  
11 providing for codification; and providing an  
12 effective date.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 19c of Title 22, unless there is  
16 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 The court, upon its own motion or upon petition by the defendant  
18 and for good cause shown, may enter an order for expungement of law  
19 enforcement and court records relating to a charge or conviction for  
20 a prostitution-related offense committed as a result of the  
21 defendant having been a victim of human trafficking. The order  
22 shall contain a statement that the expungement is ordered pursuant  
23 to this section. An order entered pursuant to this section shall be  
24 subject to the notice requirements and provisions of subsections B

through M of Section 19 of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Records expunged pursuant to this section shall be sealed to the public but not to law enforcement agencies for law enforcement purposes.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2013.
