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7 An Act relating to public health and safety; amending
8 63 O.S. 2011, Section 2-103.1, which relates to the
9 Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act;
10 expanding scope of subpoena powers for the Director
of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and
Dangerous Drugs Control; and providing an effective
date.

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13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 2-103.1, is
15 amended to read as follows:

16 Section 2-103.1 A. In any investigation relating to the
17 functions of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous
18 Drugs Control pursuant to the provisions of the Uniform Controlled
19 Dangerous Substances Act with respect to controlled substances or
20 other provisions of Oklahoma law with respect to the crimes of money
21 laundering and human trafficking, the Director of the Oklahoma State
22 Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control, if recommended and
23 approved by a chief agent of the Bureau and the legal counsel of the
24 Bureau, may subpoena witnesses, compel the attendance and testimony

1 of witnesses, and require the production of any records, including
2 books, papers, documents, and other tangible things which constitute
3 or contain evidence, which the Director or agent finds relevant or
4 material to the investigation. The attendance of witnesses and the
5 production of records may be required from any place in the state to
6 a designated location in the county seat of the county of which the
7 subpoenaed person is an inhabitant or in which the subpoenaed person
8 carries on business or may be found. Witnesses summoned pursuant to
9 this section shall be paid the same fees and mileage that are paid
10 witnesses in the courts of this state.

11 B. The witness shall have the option of complying with said
12 subpoena by:

- 13 1. Appearing and/or producing documents, as requested; or
- 14 2. Notifying the Bureau, in writing, of refusal to appear or
15 produce documents, within ten (10) days of the date of service.

16 The subpoena form shall clearly set forth the optional means of
17 compliance including instructions for sending written notice of
18 refusal.

19 C. A subpoena issued pursuant to this section may be served by
20 any person designated in the subpoena to serve it. Service upon a
21 natural person may be made by personal delivery of the subpoena to
22 him. Service may be made upon a domestic or foreign corporation or
23 upon a partnership or other unincorporated association which is
24 subject to suit under a common name, by delivering the subpoena to

1 an officer, to a managing or general agent, or to any other agent
2 authorized by appointment or by law to receive service of process.
3 The affidavit of the person serving the subpoena entered on a true
4 copy thereof by the person serving it shall be proof of service.

5 D. In the case of contumacy by or refusal to obey a subpoena
6 issued to any person, the Director may invoke the aid of any
7 district court of the state within the jurisdiction of which the
8 investigation is carried on or of which the subpoenaed person is an
9 inhabitant, or in which he carries on business or may be found, to
10 compel compliance with the subpoena. The court may issue an order
11 requiring the subpoenaed person to appear before the Director to
12 produce records, if so ordered, or to give testimony touching the
13 matter under investigation. Any failure to obey the order of the
14 court may be punished by the court as an indirect contempt thereof.
15 All process in any such case may be served in any judicial district
16 in which such person may be found.

17 E. The district court of the county wherein the subpoena is
18 served may quash a subpoena issued pursuant to this section, upon a
19 motion to quash the subpoena filed with the court by the party to
20 whom the subpoena is issued.

21 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2013.
