When committed in the lawful defense of such person $_{\tau}$  or of 20 his or her husband, wife, parent, child, master, mistress, or 21 servant another, when there is a reasonable ground to apprehend a 22 design to commit the person using force reasonably believes such 23 force is necessary to prevent death or great bodily harm to himself 24

or herself or another or to terminate or prevent the commission of a

3	3. When necessarily committed in attempting, by lawful ways and
4	means, to apprehend any person for any felony committed; or in

7	B. As used in this section, "forcible felony" means any felony
8	which involves the use or threat of physical force or violence
9	against any person.
