NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 19c of Title 22, unless there is 18 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 19 The court, upon its own motion or upon petition by the defendant 20 and for good cause shown, may enter an order for expungement of law 21 enforcement and court records relating to a charge or conviction for 22 a prostitution-related offense committed as a result of the 23 defendant having been a victim of human trafficking. The order 24 shall contain a statement that the expungement is ordered pursuant

1	to this section. An order entered pursuant to this section shall be
2	subject to the provisions of subsections D through M of Section 19
3	of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
4	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2013.
