A new section of law not to be NEW LAW 22 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows: 23 2.4 Page 1

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This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Prevention Programs Accountability Act".

- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-110.2 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. Effective November 1, 2013, the state of Oklahoma shall immediately return all federal grant funding from the Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program to the United States Department of Health and Human Services.
- B. Effective January 1, 2014, the Department of Human Services, the State Department of Health and the State Board of Education shall suspend, for one year, all home visitation programs limited to SafeCare, Start Right and Oklahoma Parents as Teachers. The State Auditor shall sequester all funds related to these programs and conduct a full audit of the funds and evaluation of the efficacy and cost-effectiveness of the programs. The State Auditor shall examine all nationally recognized evidence-based home visitation programs and make recommendations to the Legislature. The State Auditor shall develop standards for evaluating and annually report on the return on investment, efficiency and effectiveness of the home visitation programs operated by the state.
