16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1903, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	Section 1903. A. No person shall by force or violence, or
20	threat of force or violence, seize or exercise control of any bus
21	public transportation. Any person violating this subsection shall
22	be guilty of a felony $_{ au}$ and shall, upon conviction, be $^{ ext{imprisoned}}$
23	punished by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of

- <u>Corrections</u> for not more than twenty (20) years, or <u>fined</u> <u>by a fine</u> <u>of</u> not more than Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00), or <u>by</u> both such fine and imprisonment.
 - B. In addition, no person shall intimidate, threaten, assault or batter any driver, attendant, guard or passenger of any bus public transportation with intent to violate subsection A of this section. Any person violating this subsection shall be guilty of a felony, and shall, upon conviction, be imprisoned punished by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for not more than ten (10) years, or fined by a fine of not more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment.
 - C. In addition, any person violating subsection A or B of this section using a dangerous or deadly weapon shall be guilty of a felony, and shall, upon conviction, be imprisoned punished by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for not more than twenty (20) years, or fined by a fine of not more than Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment.
 - D. No person, other than an authorized law enforcement officer or person in possession of a valid handgun license issued pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act, shall board $\frac{1}{2}$ bus public transportation with a dangerous or deadly weapon concealed upon or about his or her person. Upon the discovery of

2	official may obtain possession and retain custody of such item or
3	material until it is transferred to the custody of law enforcement
4	officers. Any person convicted of violating this subsection shall
