9 AS INTRODUCED

10 An Act relating to public health and safety; creating
11 the Protection of Human Life Act of 2013; defining
12 terms; making certain actions with a human embryo
13 unlawful; providing penalty; providing for
 codification; providing an effective date; and
 declaring an emergency.

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16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
18 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

19 Section 2 of this act shall be known and may be cited as the
20 "Protection of Human Life Act of 2013".

21 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
22 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-735.1 of Title 63, unless
23 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

24 A. As used in this section:

1 1. "Human embryo" means a living organism of the species Homo
2 sapiens at the earliest stages of development, including the single-
3 celled stage, that is not located in the body of a female; and

4 2. "Nontherapeutic research" means research that is not
5 intended to help preserve the life and health of the particular
6 embryo subjected to risk. This term does not include in vitro
7 fertilization and accompanying embryo transfer to the body of a
8 female, or any diagnostic test which may assist in the future care
9 of a child subjected to the tests.

10 B. No person shall:

11 1. Knowingly conduct nontherapeutic research that destroys a
12 human embryo or subjects a human embryo to substantial risk of
13 injury or death;

14 2. Transfer a human embryo with the knowledge that the embryo
15 will be subjected to nontherapeutic research; or

16 3. Use for research purposes cells or tissues that the person
17 knows were obtained by performing activities in violation of this
18 section.

19 C. Any person found violating the provisions of subsection B of
20 this section shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a felony
21 punishable by incarceration in the custody of the Department of
22 Corrections for a term of not less than one (1) year nor more than
23 life and a fine of not less than One Hundred Thousand Dollars
24 (\$100,000.00).

1 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2013.

2 SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
3 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
4 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
5 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
