A new section of law to be codified NEW LAW 21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-13-101 of Title 27A, unless 22 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 23 Except as otherwise provided in this section, no person 24 shall dispose of the body of any deceased animal by cremation within

- 1 this state without a valid license from the Oklahoma Department of
 2 Environmental Quality.
 - B. An application for an animal crematory license shall be made to the Department on a form prescribed by the Department. The application shall specify the location of the animal crematory; the name and address of the owner; a detailed description of the equipment used for cremation, including manufacturer and model number; and any other information the Department may require to assist in performing its duties under this section.
 - C. A license shall be issued for a term of one year from date of issuance, and may be renewed for successive one-year periods. An application for a license or license renewal shall be accompanied by an animal crematory license fee. The annual license fee initially shall be Five Hundred Dollars (\$500). The Environmental Quality Board may establish by rule a different fee pursuant to Section 2-3-402 of this title.
 - D. The initial license for an animal crematory at any location shall not be issued by the Department until the Department is satisfied that:
 - 1. The animal crematory has at least one operable cremation unit; and
 - 2. There is reasonable assurance, based on manufacturer's specifications or other information satisfactory to the Department, that the cremation unit is capable of reducing the body of a

deceased animal to a residue which shall not weigh more than five percent (5%) of the weight of the body immediately after death.

The requirement of paragraph 2 of this subsection may, but need not, be waived by the Department for any subsequent annual license issued for the same crematory.

- E. The owner of the animal crematory shall annually file with the Department a report in the form prescribed by the Department describing the operations of the licensee, including the number of animal cremations performed, the disposition thereof, and any other information that the Department may require to assist in performing its duties under this section.
- F. Pursuant to the provisions of the Environmental Quality Code including, without limitation, Section 2-3-501 of this title, all animal crematories shall be subject to inspection, at all reasonable times, by the Department or its duly authorized agents or employees.
- G. Pursuant to the provisions of the Environmental Quality Code including, without limitation, Sections 2-3-502 and 2-3-504 of this title, the Department may take enforcement action against any person for violation of this section or rules adopted thereunder.
- H. The residue resulting from the cremation of an animal by a licensed crematory may be disposed of in any manner that will not create a public or private nuisance.

1	I. Nothing in this section shall be construed to exempt a
2	licensee from any other licenses, permits or regulatory
3	authorizations required under other provisions of law.
4	J. Veterinary hospitals and political subdivisions that perform
5	animal cremation services shall be exempt from the requirements of
6	this section. This section also shall not apply to the cremation of
7	an animal by the person who owned the animal at the time of its
8	death.
9	K. The Environmental Quality Board is authorized, pursuant to
10	the Administrative Procedures Act, to adopt and promulgate rules to
11	implement the provisions of this section.
12	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2014.
