At the discretion of the district attorney, the district attorney may allow an assistant district attorney to carry a firearm on his or her person anywhere in the state to use only for personal protection if the person has successfully completed an approved a handgun qualification course of firearm training conducted by a state-certified firearms instructor which meets the minimum requirements for firearms training as set forth for court officials developed by the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training. The Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training may provide for an identification card to be issued to the assistant district attorney and may provide application forms. The Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training is authorized to charge a fee of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for the issuance of the identification card. The fee shall be deposited to the credit of the Peace Officer Revolving Fund created pursuant to Section 3311.7 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- If an assistant district attorney ends his or her employment,

 the assistant district attorney shall immediately return the

 identification card to the Council on Law Enforcement Education and

 Training. If the person issued an identification card is no longer eligible, that person shall immediately return the identification

 card to the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training.

18	shall be deposited to the credit of the Peace Officer Revolving Fund

21	Law Enforcement Education and Training.
