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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 160 of Title 40, unless there is
15	created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
16	As a matter of public policy and due to an overriding state
17	interest, the Legislature hereby occupies and preempts the entire
18	field of legislation in this state touching in any way mandated
19	minimum wage and employee benefits regarding mandatory minimum
20	number of vacation or sick leave days. Notwithstanding any
21	exemption from state statutes previously allowed for certain
22	municipalities pursuant to Section 1-101 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma
23	Statutes, no municipality or other political subdivision of this

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state shall establish a mandatory minimum number of vacation or sick

leave days, whether paid or unpaid, or a minimum wage rate which an employer would be required to pay or grant employees. Any existing or future ordinances, orders or regulations in this field, except as may be specifically provided in this section, are null and void.

The provisions of this section shall not affect the minimum number of vacation or sick leave days, whether paid or unpaid, authorized by a municipality for its employees as a benefit of employment.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2013.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
