17	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
18	A court shall not seal any records or files unless specifically
19	authorized by the Oklahoma Constitution or by statute. Prior to
20	issuing an order sealing any records or files, the court shall make
21	written findings of fact and conclusions of law that shall be
22	incorporated into the order along with the specific provisions of
23	the Oklahoma Constitution or statute that authorize such an order.

The mere fact that the parties agree shall not be grounds to seal

24

any records or files. Any prior orders sealing records or files
inconsistent with the requirements of this section are null and
void.

Any resident of a county wherein such a record or file is sealed
shall have standing to challenge the order sealing said records or
files. If such an action is contested, the prevailing party shall
be entitled to attorney fees and court costs. It shall be cause for

impeachment and removal if a judge is found to have sealed files or

records in violation of this section.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2013.
