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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 11-103.6a,
17	is amended to read as follows:
18	Section 11-103.6a. A. Each area of subject matter curriculum,
19	except for technology curriculum, adopted by the State Board of
20	Education for implementation by the beginning of the 2003-04 school
21	year shall be thoroughly reviewed by the State Board every six (6)
22	years according to and in coordination with the existing subject
23	area textbook adoption cycle, and the State Board shall implement
24	any revisions in such curriculum deemed necessary to achieve further

1 improvements in the quality of education for the students of this
2 state.

By August 1, 2010, the State Board of Education shall adopt 3 Β. 4 revisions to the subject matter curriculum adopted by the State 5 Board for English Language Arts and Mathematics as is necessary to align the curriculum with the K-12 Common Core State Standards 6 7 developed by the Common Core State Standards Initiative, an effort coordinated by the National Covernors Association Center for Best 8 9 Practices and the Council of Chief State School Officers. The revised curriculum shall reflect the K-12 Common Core State 10 11 Standards in their entirety and may include additional standards as 12 long as the amount of additional standards is not more than fifteen 13 percent (15%) of the K-12 Common Core State Standards August 1, 2014, the State Board of Education shall adopt revisions to the 14 subject matter curriculum adopted by the State Board for English 15 16 Language Arts and Mathematics as is necessary to remove alignment 17 with the K-12 Common Core State Standards developed by the Common Core State Standards Initiative. Beginning July 1, 2014, the State 18 Board shall not continue to implement any curriculum standards or 19 related assessments aligned with the K-12 Common Core State 20 Standards. 21 C. The State Board of Education shall take action to initiate a 22 request with the United States Department of Education or any other 23 agency of the federal government to change or amend any requirement 24

2	Board revising the state subject matter curriculum to align with the

4	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2014.
5	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
6	of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
7	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
8	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
