7	An Act relating to motor vehicle reports; amending 47
8	O.S. 2011, Section 6-117, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 249, O.S.L. 2012 (47 O.S. Supp. 2013, Section
9	6-117), which relates to records kept by the Department of Public Safety; modifying certain fees;
10	and providing an effective date.
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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2011, Section 6-117, as
14	amended by Section 1, Chapter 249, O.S.L. 2012 (47 O.S. Supp. 2013,
15	Section 6-117), is amended to read as follows:
16	Section 6-117. A. The Department of Public Safety shall file
17	every application for a driver license or identification card
18	received by the Department and shall maintain suitable indexes
19	containing:
20	1. All applications denied and on each thereof note the reasons
21	for the denial;
22	2. All applications granted;
23	3. The name of every person whose driving privilege has been
24	suspended, revoked, cancelled, or disqualified by the Department and

1 after each such name note the reasons for the action. Any notation 2 of suspension of the driving privilege of a person for reason of 3 nonpayment of a fine shall be removed from the driving record after 4 the person has paid the fine and the driving privilege of the person 5 is reinstated as provided for by law;

4. The county of residence, the name, date of birth, and
mailing address of each person residing in that county who is
eighteen (18) years of age or older, and who is the holder of a
current driver license or a current identification card issued by
the Department of Public Safety for the purpose of ascertaining
names of all persons qualified for jury service as required by
Section 18 of Title 38 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

5. The name, driver license number, and mailing address of
every person for the purpose of giving notice, if necessary, as
required by Section 2-116 of this title.

The Department shall file all collision reports and 16 в. abstracts of court records of convictions received by it pursuant to 17 the laws of this state and maintain convenient records of the 18 records and reports or make suitable notations in order that an 19 individual record of a person showing the convictions of the person 20 and the traffic collisions in which the person has been involved 21 shall be readily ascertainable and available for the consideration 22 of the Department of Public Safety upon any application for a driver 23 license or renewal of a driver license and at other suitable times. 24

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1 Any abstract, index or other entry relating to a driving record according to the licensing authority in another state or a province 2 3 of Canada may be posted upon the driving record of any resident of this state when notice thereof is received by documentation or by 4 5 electronic transmission. The individual record of a person shall not include any collision reports and abstracts of court records 6 involving a collision in which the person was not issued a citation 7 or if a citation is issued and the person was not convicted. 8

9 С. 1. The Commissioner and the officers of the Department as 10 the Commissioner may designate are hereby authorized to prepare under the seal of the Department and deliver upon request a copy of 11 12 any collision report on file with the Department, charging a fee of: beginning on July 1, 2011, through June 30, 2013, 13 a. Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00), of which Eight Dollars 14 (\$8.00) shall be deposited by the Commissioner to the 15 credit of the Department of Public Safety Revolving 16 Fund and, in addition to other purposes authorized by 17 law, the expenditures from that fund of monies derived 18 from the Eight Dollars (\$8.00) pursuant to this 19 subparagraph shall be used to fund any Oklahoma 20 Highway Patrol Trooper Academy provided by the 21 Department. Any remaining funds shall be deposited in 22 an account to be utilized exclusively for future 23

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1 2 expenses directly related to the operation of an Oklahoma Highway Patrol Academy, and

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b. beginning on July 1, 2013, and any year thereafter,
 Seven Dollars (\$7.00).

However, the Department shall not be required to furnish
personal information from the collision report which is contrary to
the provisions of the Driver's Privacy Protection Act, 18 United
States Code, Sections 2721 through 2725.

9 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 1 of this 10 subsection, the Department is authorized to enter into contracts to 11 supply information regarding vehicles reported to be involved in collisions. For each vehicle, the information shall be limited to 12 13 that which only describes the vehicle and the collision. The Department shall not be required to provide any information 14 15 regarding the owner or operator of the vehicle or any information which would conflict with Section 2-110 or Section 1109 of this 16 17 title.

D. The Department of Public Safety or any motor license agent upon request shall prepare and furnish to any authorized person a Motor Vehicle Report of any person subject to the provisions of the motor vehicle laws of this state. However, the Department shall not be required to furnish personal information from a driving record contrary to the provisions of the Driver's Privacy Protection Act, 18 United States Code, Sections 2721 through 2725. The Motor

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1 Vehicle Report shall be a summary of the driving record of the person and shall include the enumeration of any motor vehicle 2 collisions, reference to convictions for violations of motor vehicle 3 laws, and any action taken against the privilege of the person to 4 5 operate a motor vehicle, as shown by the files of the Department for the three (3) years preceding the date of the request. 6 The Department shall not be required to release to any person, in whole 7 or in part and in any format, a driving index, as described in 8 9 subsection A of this section, except as otherwise provided for by 10 law. For each Motor Vehicle Report furnished by the Department of Public Safety, the Department shall collect the sum of Twenty-five 11 12 Dollars (\$25.00) Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00), Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) 13 Ten Dollars (\$10.00) of which shall be deposited in the General Revenue Fund and Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall be deposited in the 14 Department of Public Safety Revolving Fund. For each Motor Vehicle 15 Report furnished by a motor license agent, the agent shall collect 16 17 the sum of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00), Eighteen Dollars (\$18.00) Eight Dollars (\$8.00) of which shall be 18 paid to the Oklahoma Tax Commission for deposit in the General 19 Revenue Fund in the State Treasury, Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall be 20 deposited in the Department of Public Safety Revolving Fund and Two 21 Dollars (\$2.00) of which shall be retained by the motor license 22 agent. Persons sixty-five (65) years of age or older shall not be 23 required to pay a fee for their own Motor Vehicle Report furnished 24

by the Department or a motor license agent. For purposes of this subsection, a Motor Vehicle Report shall include a report which indicates that no driving record is on file with the Department of Public Safety for the information received by the Department in the request for the Motor Vehicle Report.

6 E. The Department of Public Safety may develop procedures7 whereby an employer of a person:

8 1. Who has a Class A, B or C driver license; and

9 2. Who operates a commercial motor vehicle in the course of his 10 or her employment with the employer, may automatically be notified, 11 pursuant to a fee schedule established by the Department, should the 12 driving record of a person reflect a traffic conviction in any court 13 or an administrative action by the Department which alters the status of the commercial driving privileges of the person. 14 The 15 notification system shall include electronic delivery of a Motor Vehicle Report at least annually for any employee who is a 16 17 commercial driver licensee or who operates a commercial motor vehicle, as required by 49 C.F.R., Section 391.25. All monies 18 received by the Commissioner of Public Safety and the officers and 19 employees of the Department pursuant to this subsection shall be 20 deposited in the Department of Public Safety Restricted Revolving 21 Fund; provided, the fee received for electronic delivery of a Motor 22 Vehicle Report shall be deposited as provided in subsection G of 23 this section. 24

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1 F. The Commissioner is authorized to establish a procedure for 2 reviewing the driving records of state residents who are existing 3 policyholders of any insurance company licensed to operate in this state during specified periods of time and producing a report which 4 5 identifies the policyholders which have had violation and/or status changes to their driving records during such time period. 6 The Department may sell such report to the insurance company or its 7 agent at a fee to be set by the Department. Any such report sold by 8 9 the Department shall only consist of information otherwise lawfully 10 obtainable by the insurance company or its agent. The fee shall be 11 sufficient to recover all costs incurred by the Department and insure that there will be no net revenue loss to the state. 12 Such 13 fee shall be deposited in the Department of Public Safety Revolving Fund. 14

G. All monies received by the Commissioner of Public Safety and 15 the officers and employees of the Department shall be remitted to 16 17 the State Treasurer to be credited to the General Revenue Fund in the State Treasury except as otherwise provided for by law. 18 SECTION 2.
