SENATE BILL 522

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to nonresident pharmacies; requiring nonresident pharmacies to submit certain information in applications for license issuance or renewal; providing for certain fees; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 355.3 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

As used in this act:

1. "Nonresident pharmacy" means any pharmacy located outside of this state which delivers, dispenses, or distributes by any method prescription drugs or devices to a user physically located in this state, in addition to the initial application or renewal form and other documents required for a pharmacy located in Oklahoma; and

2. "Pharmacist-in-charge" means a professionally competent, legally qualified pharmacist responsible for compliance with all

3 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 355.4 of Title 59, unless there
5 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

6 A nonresident pharmacy, in addition to the initial application
7 or renewal form and other documents required for a pharmacy located
8 in Oklahoma, shall:

9 1. Submit an affidavit signed by the pharmacist-in-charge that
10 the pharmacy shall comply with non-sterile and sterile compounding
11 standards of the newest edition of the United States Pharmacopeial
12 and United States Food and Drug Administration Good Manufacturing
13 Practices;

14 2. a. Submit a pharmacy site inspection form completed and
15 signed within the previous eighteen (18) months by a
16 person authorized by the pharmacy's resident state
17 agency or board which is responsible for issuing
18 pharmacy licenses,

19 b. Submit a pharmacy site inspection form completed and
20 signed within the previous eighteen (18) months by a
21 staff person employed by the Oklahoma State Board of
22 Pharmacy and pay all costs incurred by the Board for
23 completion of the inspection, or

1 c. Submit an inspection report or certificate of
2 approval, from an organization approved by the
3 Oklahoma State Board of Pharmacy, which shall include
4 the standards and procedures to which the pharmacy
5 demonstrated compliance; and

6 3. Pay an additional fee of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) over
7 and above the licensing and inspection fees charged to in-state
8 pharmacies to cover the additional costs associated with
9 administrative review and consideration of documents listed in
10 subparagraphs a, b and c of paragraph 2 of this section.

11 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2013.

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
