20	the following proposed amendment to Section 26 of Article II of the

22	Section 26. <u>A.</u> The <u>fundamental</u> right of a <u>each individual</u>
23	citizen to keep and <u>to</u> bear arms in defense of his home, person, or
24	property, including semi-automatic and manually loading handguns,

- B. Regulations of this right shall be subject to strict

 scrutiny. In particular, regulations of the exercise in public

 places of the right to bear arms shall:
 - 1. Be narrowly tailored to a compelling interest;

- 2. Be based on objective and uniform standards; and
- 3. Not impose burdens that frustrate or impair the ability of peaceable citizens to bear arms for their security and self-defense.

 Nothing contained in this subsection shall prevent this state

 from authorizing citizens of other states to bear arms in this state.
- C. This section shall not prevent legislation prohibiting the possession of arms by those convicted of any violent or otherwise dangerous felony, those adjudicated as mentally incompetent or those who have been committed to any mental institution.
- D. No law shall impose licensure, registration or special taxation on the acquisition, ownership or possession of arms, ammunition or the components of arms or ammunition.
