NEW LAW 15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2915.1 of Title 68, unless there 16 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 17 For assessment years beginning January 1, 2015, any taxpayer who 18 has one or more children who attend private school or who are home-19 schooled shall have a credit against the ad valorem tax liability 20 which the person would otherwise be required to pay. The credit 21 amount shall be equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the total ad 22 valorem tax bill the person received from the county treasurer for 23 any assessment year during which such child or children attended a

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private school or were home schooled.

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SECTION 2. This act shall become effective January 1, 2015.
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
