Section 1290.9), which relates to the Oklahoma Self- Defense Act; modifying certain eligibility
requirement; and providing an effective date.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.9, as
amended by Section 30, Chapter 259, O.S.L. 2012 (21 O.S. Supp. 2013,
Section 1290.9), is amended to read as follows:
Section 1290.9
ELIGIBILITY
The following requirements shall apply to any person making
application to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation for a
handgun license pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Self-
Defense Act. The person must:
1. Be a citizen of the United States;
2. Establish a residency in the State of Oklahoma. For
purposes of the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act, the term "residency"

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shall apply to any person who either possesses a valid Oklahoma

driver license or state photo identification card, and physically

maintains a residence in this state or to any person, including the

spouse of such person, who has permanent military orders within this

state and possesses a valid driver license from another state where

such person claims and spouse of such person claim residency;

- 3. Be at least twenty-one (21) years of age;
- 4. Complete a firearms safety and training course and demonstrate competence and qualifications with the type of pistol to be carried by the person as provided in Section 1290.14 of this title, and submit proof of training and qualification or an exemption for training and qualification as authorized by Section 1290.14 of this title;
- 5. Submit the required fee and complete the application process as provided in Section 1290.12 of this title; and
- 6. Comply in good faith with the provisions of the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act.
