# **Research Analysis**

Introduced HB1060 prohibits the application of foreign laws when the application violates a right guaranteed by the state and federal constitution and defines foreign law as any law, legal code, or system of jurisdiction outside the United States and applied by that jurisdiction's courts, administrative bodies, or other formal or informal tribunals, excluding any law of the Native American tribes in Oklahoma. The measure does not apply to a corporation, association, partnership, limited liability company, limited liability partnership or other legal entity that contracts to subject itself to foreign law or courts in a jurisdiction other than Oklahoma or the United States.
