## **Research Analysis**

The CS for HB 1062 would allow a handgun to be carried into any elementary or secondary school by a teacher or administrator who has completed a basic police academy for reserve deputies if the board of education has adopted a policy authorizing the carrying of a handgun. Authorizes the board of education of a school district to allow school personnel who have been issued an SDA license to carry in the school if the person has completed a special reserve school resource officer academy developed by CLEET. The course shall be a minimum of 120 hours of education and training. The board of education is to pay for the costs of training associated with the academy. After completion, school personnel has statewide peace officer powers while performing official duties as an employee of the school. Provides for immunity from civil and criminal liability. Allows the board of education for a school district to enter into memorandum of understanding with local law enforcement entities. Directs CLEET to develop curriculum for academy.
