Research Analysis

The measure instructs school districts that elect to stock epinephrine injectors to update policies on the self-administration of anaphylaxis medication by a student. The policy must allow the school district to inform the parent or guardian of each student that a school nurse or employee trained by a health care professional or in correlation with the State Department of Health's Diabetes Management Annual School Training Program may administer without a health care provider order, an Epinephrine injector to a student believed to be having an anaphylaxis reaction. The school district and its employees will incur no liability as a result of any injury. A licensed physician who has prescriptive authority may write a prescription for Epinephrine injectors for school sites and will incur no liability as a result of injury. The school district may keep a minimum of two injectors in a secure location at each school.
