## **Research Analysis**

The committee substitute to HB 2805 creates the Oklahoma Firearms Sales and Manufacturing Initiative. The measure provides that firearms, firearm accessories or ammunition manufactured and owned in Oklahoma that remains within the borders of Oklahoma is not subject to federal law, treaty, federal regulation or federal executive action, including any federal firearm or ammunition registration program. Prohibits any official, agent or employee of the state, or any dealer selling any firearm in the state from enforcing any law or regulation of the United States regarding any personal firearm, firearm accessory or ammunition that is manufactured and owned in Oklahoma. Creates a new felony for any official, agent or employee of the state, or any dealer selling any firearm in the state to enforce any law or regulation of the United States regarding any personal firearm, firearm accessory or ammunition that is manufactured and owned in Oklahoma.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

The CS for HB2805 creates a new felony for persons who enforce or attempt to enforce any act, law, treaty, order, rule or regulation of the government of the United States regarding a firearm, a firearm accessory, or ammunition that is manufactured commercially or privately and owned in the State of Oklahoma and that remains within the borders of Oklahoma. They penalty is not less than one year imprisonment and/or a fine of \$5,000. Every person convicted and sentenced to the custody of the Department of Corrections costs the state approximately \$49 per day for each day of incarceration. The fiscal impact would be dependent upon the number of adjudicated cases and the length of the prison term imposed.
