Research Analysis

The committee substitute for HB 2911 prohibits the linking of individual student data across the educational field. Vendors and organizations, independent of the State Department of Education, will be prohibited from storing individual student data. Additionally, the measure prohibits the collection of individual student data via digital software or interactive application on any electronic device used by a student for educational purposes that could be shared with such a vendor or organization. The measure requires school districts to obtain a written consent form from parents annually that explains the release of individual student data that is not otherwise required by law and state the purpose of the release and the name of the entity for which the data was released. The measure prohibits the State from entering into agreements or consortiums with any entity that would cede control of academic standards; using federal or private funds for any statewide longitudinal data system or complying with Executive Order 2013-40; and from entering into agreements or contracts that would cede state control over state educational standards or systems. Lastly, the state is directed to amend any agreements or contracts to comply with the measure.

Fiscal Analysis

State Department of Education personnel provide that language in this measure could cause a potential loss of approximately \$361.4 million in federal funds in the areas of IDEA, Title I, Migrant Education and Consortium, Personnel Dev. Grant, Homeless Children and Youth, Twenty First Century CLC, Rural and Low Income School Programs, specific Title II and Title III programs and Education State Longitudinal Data System Grant.
