Research Analysis

The measure retitles the home bakery act of 2013 to the safe food manufacturing act. It modifies the definition of *home food establishment* by specifying that such products can be sold at farmers markets, on site, cooperatives, or at membership-based buying clubs. Additionally, the definition of *prepared food* now includes low risk food products. The measure defines *low risk food products* and *basic food handler training*. Home food establishment labeling must be in an FDA-approved format and contain batch code documentation. Such documentation must be kept for 2 years. Additional records that must be kept by the establishment include basic food handler training certification; copies of the prepared food labels; an approval letter from the Food and Agricultural Products Center at Oklahoma State University for all low risk food products; a list of ingredients; and a list of sales outlets for the products. The home food establishment must display their basic food handler training certificate at the point of sale.
