Research Analysis

SB 522 requires nonresident pharmacies to submit a signed affidavit by the pharmacist-in-charge that the pharmacy will comply with non-sterile and sterile compounding standards if the U.S. Pharmacopeial and Untied States Food and Drug Administration Good Manufacturing Practices. Additionally, these pharmacies must pay an additional fee of \$100 to cover the additional costs associated with administrative review and consideration of subsequent documents listed in the measure. Additional documents include a pharmacy site inspection form from both this state and the pharmacy's resident state and an inspection report or certificate of approval from an organization approved by the State Board of Pharmacy. Lastly, the measure stipulates that women under the age of 17 must obtain a prescription for the "morning after" pill and it must be made available to women 17 years of age and older without a prescription.

Fiscal Analysis

SB 522 provides regulation for Nonresident pharmacies through the Board of Pharmacy. The measure provides a fee to offset the costs to the Board of such regulation; designed to make the measure budget neutral for the Board. The Board is a non-appropriated state agency therefore the measure does not have a direct fiscal impact on the State Budget or Appropriations. The measure also regulates the dispensing of emergency contraception, which has no direct fiscal impact on the State Budget or Appropriations..
