**Research Analysis**

SB 549 adds crimes relating to exploitation of elderly persons or disabled adults, computer crimes, unlawful proceeds, insurance fraud, and workers' compensation fraud to the list of crimes which can be considered racketeering activity under the provisions of the Oklahoma Racketeer-Influenced and Corrupt Organizations Act.

**Fiscal Analysis**

Engrossed SB549 expands the definition of racketeering to include exploitation of elderly persons, insurance fraud, and workers' compensation fraud. The penalty for racketeering is an additional minimum of ten years imprisonment. The fiscal impact is dependent upon the number of adjudicated cases and the terms of incarceration imposed.
