**Research Analysis**

SB951 provides that any court, arbitration, tribunal or administrative agency ruling based on foreign law, which suppresses the fundamental liberties, rights and privileges granted by the US and Oklahoma Constitution, is void and unenforceable. Corporations, partnerships or limited liability companies, business associations or other legal entities are exempt and may choose to subject themselves to foreign law. Foreign law is defined as any law, legal code, or system of a jurisdiction outside of any state or territory of the United States, including international organizations and tribunals, and applied by that jurisdiction's courts, administrative bodies or other formal or informal tribunal.
