7	An Act relating to aerial luminaries; making it
8	unlawful to sell, offer for sale, distribute, possess, ignite or otherwise use aerial luminaries; defining term: amending 68 0 5 2011 Costion 1628
9	defining term; amending 68 O.S. 2011, Section 1628, which relates to certain violations, penalties and enforcement; providing penalties for certain
10	violations; providing for seizure and custody of certain contraband; providing for certain appeal;
11	authorizing certain court to return or destroy certain contraband; providing for codification; and
12	declaring an emergency.

15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1624.1 of Title 68, unless there
18	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	A. It shall be unlawful to sell, offer for sale, distribute,
20	possess, ignite, or otherwise use aerial luminaries, commonly known
21	as sky lanterns, Hawaii lanterns, Knogming Lanterns, Chinese
22	lanterns, sky candles, fire balloons or flying luminaries.
23	B. As used in this section, "aerial luminary" means an airborne
24	paper lantern containing a small candle, or other device for fuel,

1 that heats air from inside the lantern causing the lantern to rise 2 into the air and remain airborne until the candle or other device 3 extinguishes.

4 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 68 O.S. 2011, Section 1628, is 5 amended to read as follows:

6 Section 1628. <u>A.</u> Violation of any provision of this act is a
7 misdemeanor punishable as follows:

8 (a) <u>1.</u> Discharging fireworks <u>or igniting aerial luminaries</u> in
9 violation of this act shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed
10 One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).; and

(b) 2. Illegal sale, violation of licensing provision, false 11 12 labeling, or any other violation of this act shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), ninety (90) 13 days' imprisonment in the county jail, or both. In the event of a 14 second conviction the license shall be revoked for a period of 15 eighteen (18) months. Each violation of this act shall constitute a 16 separate offense. No other person shall be granted a license to 17 operate in the same location during the period of a revoked license. 18 (c) B. The State Fire Marshal, his deputies, or any authorized 19 20 police or peace officer of this state shall seize as contraband any illegal fireworks or aerial luminaries as defined under the terms of 21 this act. Fireworks or aerial luminaries seized in the enforcement 22 of this act shall be held in custody of the county sheriff in which 23 county such fireworks or aerial luminaries were seized. The party 24

surrendering the fireworks <u>or aerial luminaries</u>, if aggrieved by the action, may file an appeal in writing to the district court in the county where fireworks <u>or aerial luminaries</u> were seized. Upon hearing the appeal, the district court may authorize the return of part or all of the confiscated fireworks <u>or aerial luminaries</u>; otherwise, the court shall authorize and direct that such contraband fireworks <u>or aerial luminaries</u> be destroyed.

8 (d) <u>C.</u> The provisions of this act shall be enforced by the 9 State Fire Marshal and local fire marshals, the sheriff, the police 10 or any peace officer licensed or authorized by this state or by 11 their respective deputies.

12 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 13 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby 14 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and 15 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
