General Subject Matter: Oklahoma Open Records Act

General Description of <u>Major Differences</u> between the current report and the version last seen and voted on in the House and the sections in which such differences are located:

√ Changes from engrossed House measure which were made in the Senate and contained in conference committee report/substitute (applies *only* to House measures):

Audio recordings from equipment attached to the officer or their vehicle would be kept available in a records request. Records from such equipment could be redacted or obscured under certain conditions.

Audio and video recordings from a body camera would also be kept available if they depict certain events, including the use of force, arrests, detentions, or actions that lead to investigation or charges, with similar redaction provisions.

√ Changes made in conference:

Clarification to language relating to specific circumstances in which recordings may be redacted, may be held, or may be released.

Extend waiting period for disclosure of a body camera recording if it includes material relating to an ongoing criminal investigation or prosecution from one day to ten days. Extensions would be made in one-month increments rather than six months.
