16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2011, Section 14-104, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	Section 14-104. Absentee ballots shall be returned to the
20	secretary of each county election board no later than 7:00 p.m. the
21	day of the election; provided, absentee ballots that are hand
22	delivered to the county election board as provided in Section 14-108
23	of this title shall be delivered no later than the end of regular
24	business hours on the day prior to the date of the election.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2011, Section 14-108, is amended to read as follows:

Section 14-108. A. The voter shall be required to mark the ballot in ink or other manner as prescribed by the Secretary of the State Election Board; seal the ballots in the plain opaque envelope; fill out completely and sign the affidavit, such signature to be notarized at no charge by a notary public; seal the plain opaque envelope inside the envelope bearing the affidavit and return both envelopes, sealed inside the return envelope, by hand delivery, United States mail or by a private mail service, provided such service has delivery documentation, to the county election board. No person who is a candidate for an office on the ballot or who is the chair or treasurer of the campaign of a candidate for office or who is related within the third degree of consanguinity or affinity to a candidate on the ballot may witness any absentee ballot affidavit.

- B. The ballot shall not be notarized by any person whose name appears on the ballot as a candidate or by any campaign chairperson or campaign treasurer for a candidate whose name appears on the ballot.
- C. Any voter who hand delivers his or her ballot as provided in subsection A of this section shall provide proof of identity to the county election board and shall hand deliver the ballot no later than the end of regular business hours on the day prior to the date
