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COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 150.6a, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 351, O.S.L. 2013 (74 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 150.6a), which relates to salaries; modifying and establishing salaries of employees of Bureau; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 150.6a, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 351, O.S.L. 2013 (74 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 150.6a), is amended to read as follows:

Section 150.6a. A. Effective July 1, 2004, the annual salaries for the Deputy Director, and the positions within the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, as set out in this section, shall be in accordance and conformity with the following salary schedule, exclusive of longevity pay as authorized by Section 840-2.18 of this title:

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The salary of the Deputy Director shall be ninety-five
            percent (95%) of that received by the Director;
        2. Division Director:
            The salary of a Division Director shall be ninety percent
            (90%) of that received by the Director;
        3. Agent I (OSBI), Criminalist I:
            Minimum $33,500.00, Mid-point $41,875.00,
            Maximum $50,250.00;
        4. Agent II (OSBI), Criminalist II:
            Minimum $39,250.00, Mid-point $49,062.00,
            Maximum $58,875.00;

            Minimum $46,250.00, Mid-point $57,812.00,
            Maximum $69,375.00;
        6. Agent IV (OSBI), Criminalist IV:

        B. Effective July 1, 2004, positions allocated to the agent and
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    criminalist job families may receive additional compensation through
    the use of pay mechanisms provided for in the Oklahoma Personnel Act
    and the Merit System of Personnel Administration Rules.

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C. Effective January 1, 2013, the annual salaries for the
Deputy Director, and the positions within the Oklahoma State Bureau
of Investigation, as set out in this section, shall be in accordance
and conformity with the following salary schedule, exclusive of
longevity pay as authorized by Section 840-2.18 of this title:
   1. Deputy Director:
       The salary of the Deputy Director shall be ninety-five
       percent (95%) of that received by the Director+
   2. Division Director:
       The salary of a Division Director shall be ninety percent
        (90%) of that received by the Director+

       Minimum $40,778.00, Mid-point $49,153.00,
       Maximum $57,528.00;
   4. Agent II (OSBI), Criminalist II:
       Minimum $46,260.00, Mid-point $56,072.00,
       Maximum $65,885.00;
   5. Agent III (OSBI), Criminalist III:
       Minimum $51,980.00, Mid-point $63,542.00,
       Maximum $75,105.00;

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Minimum \$66,386.00, Mid-point \$80,386.00,

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Provided, however, no such employee shall receive less than the salary the employee received on December 31, 2006. Subject to the availability of funds, the annual salaries for Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation employees shall be in accordance and conformity with the findings of the State of Oklahoma Total Remuneration Study of 2013, exclusive of longevity pay, as authorized by Section 840-2.18 of this title or the findings of state or agency salary, compensation, and remuneration studies or surveys approved by the Human Capital Management Division of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.

Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit a reduction in pay or salary due to involuntary leave without pay as authorized in Section 840-2.27C of this title.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2015.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
