WHEREAS, 4-H is the youth component of the Cooperative Extension Service and has been serving Oklahoma's young people between the ages of 5 and 19 since 1908, and helping them create their futures by developing valuable life skills they will carry on throughout all aspects of their lives; and

WHEREAS, youth involved in the 4-H program are four times more likely to make contributions to their communities through volunteerism and citizenship activities; and

WHEREAS, Oklahoma 4-H reaches 111,000 youth members and 8,000 volunteer leaders annually; and

WHEREAS, 4-H youth across the nation continue to make a difference in their cities and towns by being civically active; and

WHEREAS, 4-H members continue to work together to follow the 4-H motto of "To Make the Best Better" in all communities across the state; and

WHEREAS, volunteer leaders and Oklahoma 4-H members combined annually contribute more than 135,000 volunteer hours of service, valued at a \$2.5 million contribution back to their communities and state; and

WHEREAS, 4-H, as part of the Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service, provided by Oklahoma State University and Langston University, where youth are twice as likely to participate in science, engineering and computer technology programs; and

WHEREAS, 4-H girls are more likely to take part in science programs compared to girls in other out-of-school time activities; and

WHEREAS, Oklahoma's 4-H'ers are two times as likely as non-club members to make healthier choices in life.
