11 An Act relating to open records; amending 51 O.S.
12 2011, Section 24A.5, as amended by Section 1, Chapter
13 370, O.S.L. 2015 (51 O.S. Supp. 2015, Section 24A.5),
14 which relates to the inspection and copying of
15 records of public bodies and public officials;
16 permitting Social Security numbers in public records
17 to be confidential and redacted or deleted prior to
18 release of record; and providing an effective date.

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

20 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 51 O.S. 2011, Section 24A.5, as
21 amended by Section 1, Chapter 370, O.S.L. 2015 (51 O.S. Supp. 2015,
22 Section 24A.5), is amended to read as follows:

23 Section 24A.5 All records of public bodies and public officials
24 shall be open to any person for inspection, copying, or mechanical
25 reproduction during regular business hours; provided:

1 1. The Oklahoma Open Records Act, Sections 24A.1 through 24A.30
2 of this title, does not apply to records specifically required by
3 law to be kept confidential including:

4 a. records protected by a state evidentiary privilege
5 such as the attorney-client privilege, the work
6 product immunity from discovery and the identity of
7 informer privileges,

8 b. records of what transpired during meetings of a public
9 body lawfully closed to the public such as executive
10 sessions authorized under the Oklahoma Open Meeting
11 Act,

12 c. personal information within driver records as defined
13 by the Driver's Privacy Protection Act, 18 United
14 States Code, Sections 2721 through 2725,

15 d. information in the files of the Board of Medicolegal
16 Investigations obtained pursuant to Sections 940 and
17 941 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes that may be
18 hearsay, preliminary unsubstantiated investigation-
19 related findings, or confidential medical information,
20 or

21 e. any test forms, question banks and answer keys
22 developed for state licensure examinations, but
23 specifically excluding test preparation materials or
24 study guides;

1 2. All Social Security numbers included in a record may be
2 confidential regardless of the person's status as a public employee
3 or private individual and may be redacted or deleted prior to
4 release of the record by the public body;

5 3. Any reasonably segregable portion of a record containing
6 exempt material shall be provided after deletion of the exempt
7 portions; provided however, the Department of Public Safety shall
8 not be required to assemble for the requesting person specific
9 information, in any format, from driving records relating to any
10 person whose name and date of birth or whose driver license number
11 is not furnished by the requesting person.

12 The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation shall not be required
13 to assemble for the requesting person any criminal history records
14 relating to persons whose names, dates of birth, and other
15 identifying information required by the Oklahoma State Bureau of
16 Investigation pursuant to administrative rule are not furnished by
17 the requesting person;

18 ~~3.~~ 4. Any request for a record which contains individual
19 records of persons, and the cost of copying, reproducing or
20 certifying each individual record is otherwise prescribed by state
21 law, the cost may be assessed for each individual record, or portion
22 thereof requested as prescribed by state law. Otherwise, a public
23 body may charge a fee only for recovery of the reasonable, direct
24 costs of record copying, or mechanical reproduction.

1 Notwithstanding any state or local provision to the contrary, in no
2 instance shall the record copying fee exceed twenty-five cents
3 (\$0.25) per page for records having the dimensions of eight and one-
4 half (8 1/2) by fourteen (14) inches or smaller, or a maximum of One
5 Dollar (\$1.00) per copied page for a certified copy. However, if
6 the request:

7 a. is solely for commercial purpose, or

8 b. would clearly cause excessive disruption of the
9 essential functions of the public body,

10 then the public body may charge a reasonable fee to recover the
11 direct cost of record search and copying; however, publication in a
12 newspaper or broadcast by news media for news purposes shall not
13 constitute a resale or use of a record for trade or commercial
14 purpose and charges for providing copies of electronic data to the
15 news media for a news purpose shall not exceed the direct cost of
16 making the copy. The fee charged by the Department of Public Safety
17 for a copy in a computerized format of a record of the Department
18 shall not exceed the direct cost of making the copy unless the fee
19 for the record is otherwise set by law.

20 Any public body establishing fees under this act shall post a
21 written schedule of the fees at its principal office and with the
22 county clerk.

23 In no case shall a search fee be charged when the release of
24 records is in the public interest, including, but not limited to,

1 release to the news media, scholars, authors and taxpayers seeking
2 to determine whether those entrusted with the affairs of the
3 government are honestly, faithfully, and competently performing
4 their duties as public servants.

5 The fees shall not be used for the purpose of discouraging
6 requests for information or as obstacles to disclosure of requested
7 information;

8 ~~4.~~ 5. The land description tract index of all recorded
9 instruments concerning real property required to be kept by the
10 county clerk of any county shall be available for inspection or
11 copying in accordance with the provisions of the Oklahoma Open
12 Records Act; provided, however, the index shall not be copied or
13 mechanically reproduced for the purpose of sale of the information;

14 ~~5.~~ 6. A public body must provide prompt, reasonable access to
15 its records but may establish reasonable procedures which protect
16 the integrity and organization of its records and to prevent
17 excessive disruptions of its essential functions; and

18 ~~6.~~ 7. A public body shall designate certain persons who are
19 authorized to release records of the public body for inspection,
20 copying, or mechanical reproduction. At least one person shall be
21 available at all times to release records during the regular
22 business hours of the public body.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2016.
