Supp. 2015, Section 78a), which relates 12 to the requisition of motor vehicles; adding exemption; requiring certain report; authorizing Department to sunset program; providing an effective 13 date; and declaring an emergency. 14 15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 16 SECTION 1. 74 O.S. 2011, Section 78a, as 17 AMENDATORY amended by Section 729, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp. 18 2015, Section 78a), is amended to read as follows: 19 20 Section 78a. A. State agencies with authority to own motor vehicles shall submit a requisition to the Director of the Office of 21 Management and Enterprise Services prior to acquisition of a motor 22 vehicle. The requisition shall state the type of vehicle, the 23 24 intended purpose of the vehicle, a statement that the agency has

- actual need for the vehicle, the supplier of the vehicle, that the

  state agency has sufficient funds to acquire and maintain the

  vehicle and cite the statutory authority of the state agency to

  acquire a vehicle.
  - B. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall review the requisition and approve or deny the request of the state agency within fifteen (15) days of receipt.
  - C. The provisions of subsections A and B of this section shall not apply to the Department of Public Safety or , the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control or the Oklahoma Military Department.
  - D. The provisions of subsections A and B of this section shall not apply to CompSource Oklahoma if CompSource Oklahoma is operating pursuant to a pilot program authorized by Sections 3316 and 3317 of this title.
  - E. The Oklahoma Military Department shall annually report to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Secretary of Finance the amount of savings realized from its authority to purchase motor vehicles. If such report is not filed or does not document such savings, the authority of the Department to purchase motor vehicles shall cease to be in effect on January 1, 2022.
  - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2016.

1	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
2	of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
3	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
4	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
