BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 55TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law, the following proposed amendment to the Oklahoma Constitution by adding a new Section 9A to Article II to read as follows:

Section 9A. All statutes of this state requiring, authorizing, imposing or relating to the death penalty are in full force and effect, subject to legislative amendment or repeal by statute, initiative or referendum. Any method of execution shall be allowed, unless prohibited by the United States Constitution. Methods of execution may be designated by the Legislature. A sentence of death shall not be reduced on the basis that a method of execution is

1	invalid. In any case in which an execution method is declared
2	invalid, the death sentence shall remain in force until the sentence
3	can be lawfully executed by any valid method. The death penalty
4	provided for under such statutes shall not be deemed to be, or to
5	constitute, the infliction of cruel or unusual punishments, nor
6	shall such punishment be deemed to contravene any other provision of
7	this Constitution.
