AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to testing; prohibiting the amount of time devoted to administering certain assessments from exceeding certain time allotment; allowing time allotment to be exceeded under certain circumstances; providing an exemption for certain assessments; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

- A new section of law to be codified SECTION 1. NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1210.508-4 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- The amount of time devoted to administration of assessments Α. required by Sections 1210.508 and 1210.523 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes and federal law for each student in each grade shall not exceed two percent (2%) of the minimum classroom instruction time required by Section 1-109 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- The provisions of subsection A of this section may be exceeded as needed to:

- 2. Provide test accommodations that are appropriate for English language learners who are receiving instruction in an English language learner program.
- C. Time allotted to administer the following assessments shall be exempt from the provisions of subsection A of this section:
- 1. Assessments that are above the grade level of the student; and
- 2. The American College Testing Program (ACT), the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT), the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude

  Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) and the International Baccalaureate (IB) tests.
  - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2016.
- SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
