SENATE BILL 1184

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to handguns; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.24, as amended by Section 42, Chapter 259, O.S.L. 2012 (21 O.S. Supp. 2015, Section 1290.24), which relates to immunity; modifying inclusions, providing exception of applicability of requirements; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.24, as amended by Section 42, Chapter 259, O.S.L. 2012 (21 O.S. Supp. 2015, Section 1290.24), is amended to read as follows:

Section 1290.24.

IMMUNITY

A. The state, or any political subdivision of the state as defined in Section 152 of Title 51 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and its officers, agents and employees shall be immune from liability resulting or arising from:

1. Failure to prevent the licensing of an individual for whom the receipt of the license is unlawful pursuant to the provisions of

1 the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act or any other provision of law of this
2 state;

3 2. Any action or misconduct with a pistol committed by a person
4 to whom a license to carry a concealed or unconcealed handgun has
5 been issued pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Self-Defense
6 Act or by any person who obtains a pistol from a licensee;

7 3. Any injury to any person during a handgun training course
8 conducted by a firearms instructor certified by the Council on Law
9 Enforcement Education and Training to conduct training under the
10 Oklahoma Self-Defense Act, or injury from any misfire or malfunction
11 of any handgun on a training course firing range supervised by a
12 certified firearms instructor under the provisions of the Oklahoma
13 Self-Defense Act, or any injury resulting from carrying a concealed
14 or unconcealed handgun pursuant to a handgun license; and

15 4. Any action or finding pursuant to a hearing conducted in
16 accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act as required in the
17 Oklahoma Self-Defense Act.

18 B. Firearms instructors certified by the Council on Law
19 Enforcement Education and Training to conduct training for the
20 Oklahoma Self-Defense Act shall be immune from liability to third
21 persons resulting or arising from any claim based on an act or
22 omission of a trainee.

23 C. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to claims
24 pursuant to the Administrative Workers' Compensation Act.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2016.
