5	salaries for Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation employees shall
6	be in accordance and conformity with the findings of the State of
7	Oklahoma Total Remuneration Study of 2013, exclusive of longevity
8	pay, as authorized by Section 840-2.18 of this title or the findings
9	of state or agency salary, compensation, and remuneration studies or
1 0	surveys approved by the Human Capital Management Division of the
1 1	Office of Management and Enterprise Services.
1 2	Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit a
1 3	reduction in pay or salary due to involuntary leave without pay as
1 4	authorized in Section 840-2.27C of this title.
1 5	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2015.
1 6	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
1 7	of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
1 8	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
1 9	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
