**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 1097, as introduced, would require elections for the office of county sheriff to be conducted on a nonpartisan basis, beginning with the 2016 election cycle. The State Election Board estimates a cost range of \$55,000 to \$425,000 for these elections if held in all 77 counties. If the race can be included on partisan ballots, and a nonpartisan ballot is required only for Independents, then the smaller fiscal impact would apply; if a nonpartisan ballot for all voters is printed, the larger fiscal impact would apply.
