## **Research Analysis**

The committee substitute to HB 1329 provides that when a lethality assessment conducted during a preliminary investigation of a domestic violence crime establishes probable cause for a peace officer to believe the victim is in imminent risk of death or serious bodily harm, the officer is to contact a district court judge and seek intervention of the court. After review of the probable cause, the court may order the person to appear within 48 hours for a hearing to determine if an ankle monitor should be placed on the person until a hearing on a temporary victim protective order is held.
