Research Analysis

HB 1518 creates the Justice Safety Valve Act. The measure allows the court to depart from the applicable minimum mandatory criminal sentence if the court finds substantial and compelling reasons that the imposition of the minimum mandatory sentence would result in substantial injustice to the defendant and that the minimum mandatory sentence is not necessary for the protection of the public. The measure prevents the court from departing from the minimum mandatory sentence if the crime involved physical force or serious injury to another person, the crime was a sex offence, the crime involved a firearm that caused injury, the defendant was previously convicted for the same offense within the last 10 years, or if the defendant was the leader of others in a continuing criminal enterprise. The measure requires that departures from minimum mandatory sentencing be reported to the Clerk of the Court of Criminal Appeals and be available on the Court of Criminal Appeals website.
