HB 1607 provides that before administering a breath or blood test for the presence of alcohol or other intoxicating substance, law enforcement is required to give oral and written notice that Oklahoma law requires the person to submit to the test and that if the person refuses the test, that the person will lose their driving privileges and will be required to have an ignition interlock for not less than 18 months following the mandatory revocation period.
