**Fiscal Analysis**

According to officials with the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, HB1683 is expected to increase the number of samples submitted to the OSBI Laboratory for processing and inclusion in the Combined DNA Index System (CODIS) by an unknown number. There could possibly be as many as 5,000 to 10,000 additional samples. This would increase OSBI costs for kits and consumables approximately \$110,500 to \$221,000 annually.
