Research Analysis

SA to HB 1965 prohibits a person from operating a motor vehicle while using a hand-held electronic communication device to manually compose, send or read an electronic text message while the vehicle is in motion. The measure establishes a fine of not more than \$100. The Department of Public Safety is not to record or assess points for violations. The measure provides that the prohibition on the use of a device does not apply if the person is communicating with an emergency response operator; hospital, ambulance service, firefighting services, or law enforcement. The measure allows municipalities to enact ordinances prohibiting and penalizing the use of a hand-held electronic communication device in the same manner as state law.

Fiscal Analysis

Upon review of the measure, it has been determined to have no measureable revenue or fiscal considerations. The Senate Amendment establishes a \$100.00 fine for those who are convicted of violating the provisions of the Act. The fiscal impact of the imposed fine will be contingent upon the amount of convictions.
