## **Fiscal Analysis**

State Department of Education

Full PCS1 for HB 2014 creates the Special Reserve School Resource Officer Act. A handgun may be carried into any public elementary or public secondary school by school personnel who have successfully completed a special reserve school resource officer academy, provided that a policy has been adopted by the school district board of education. The academy will be conducted and governed by the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET). A school district board of education may pay all necessary associated expenses for participating authorized personnel. The measure has no fiscal impact to the State Department of Education, and potential costs to local school districts choosing to pay for authorized school personnel related expenses.

According to officials with CLEET:

Annually recurring costs: \$128,930. Estimate is based on salary and fringe for one full-time employee to develop the curriculum for and conduct special reserve school resource officer academies (\$71,200 total consisting of \$41,130 salary and \$30,070 for health insurance, retirement contribution, FICA match and other fringe benefits) and one full-time employee to provide clerical and enrollment support, as well as to track education and continuing education compliance (\$57,730 total consisting of \$30,280 salary and \$27,450 for health insurance, retirement contribution, FICA match and other fringe benefits).
